Romania is a country located at the intersection of Central and Southeastern Europe, bordering with the Black Sea.

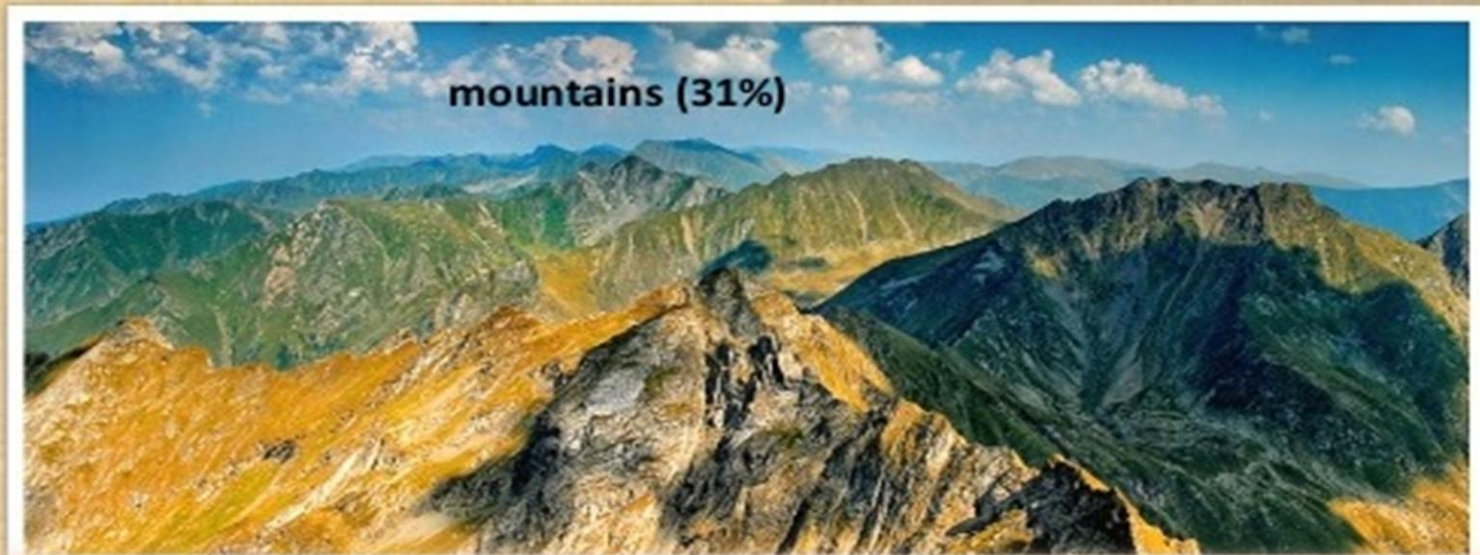
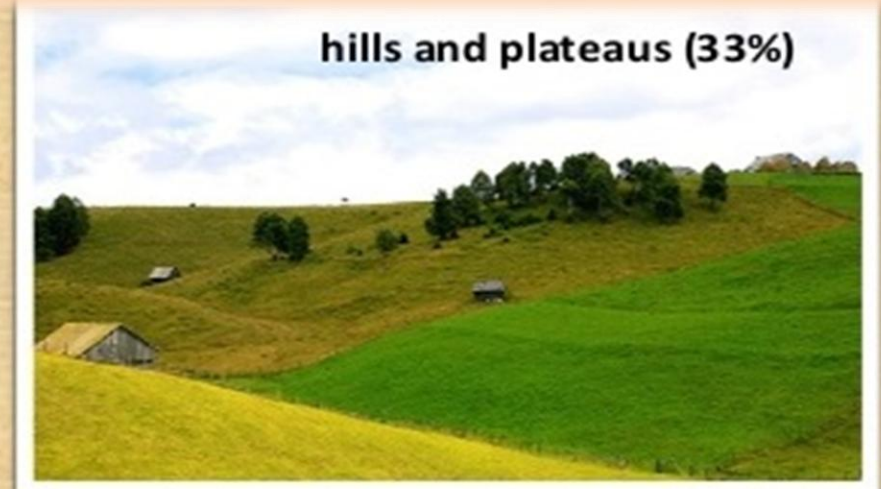




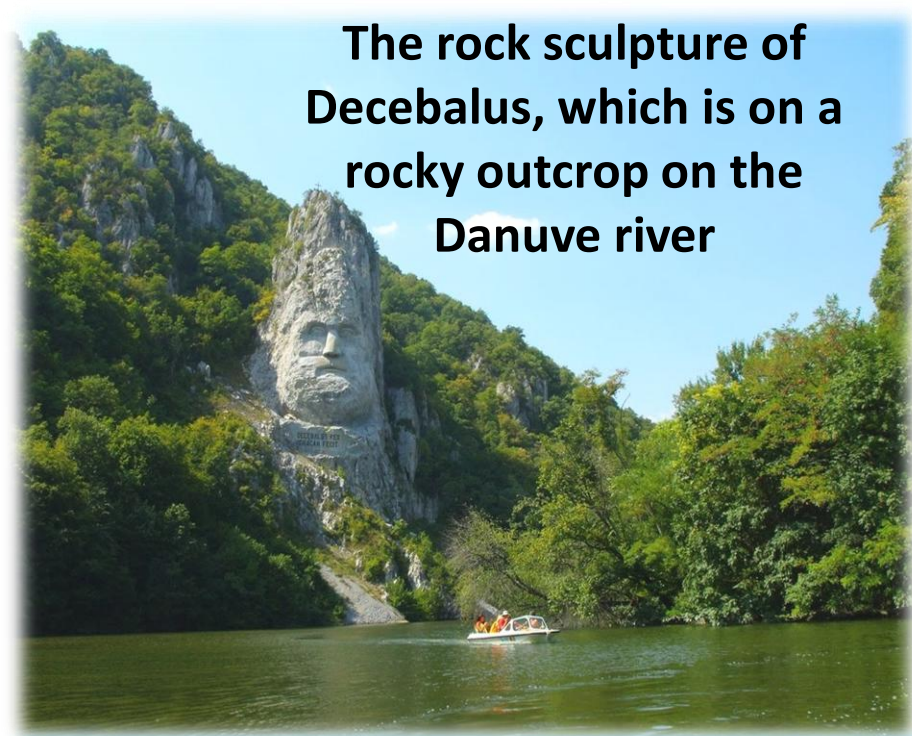
Romania shares a border with **HUNGARY** and **SERBIA** to the west, **UKRAINE** and **MOLDOVA** to the north-east and east, and **BULGARIA** to the south.

With 238,400 square kilometers, Romania is the ninth largest country of the European Union by area, and has the seventh largest population of the European Union with more than 19 million people.

Romania has a varied relief. The Carpathians mountains are in the center of the country, bordered on both sides by hills and plateaus and finally the great plains of the outer rim.

ROMANIA IS ALSO BEST KNOWN FOR ITS IMPORTANT PERSONALITIES

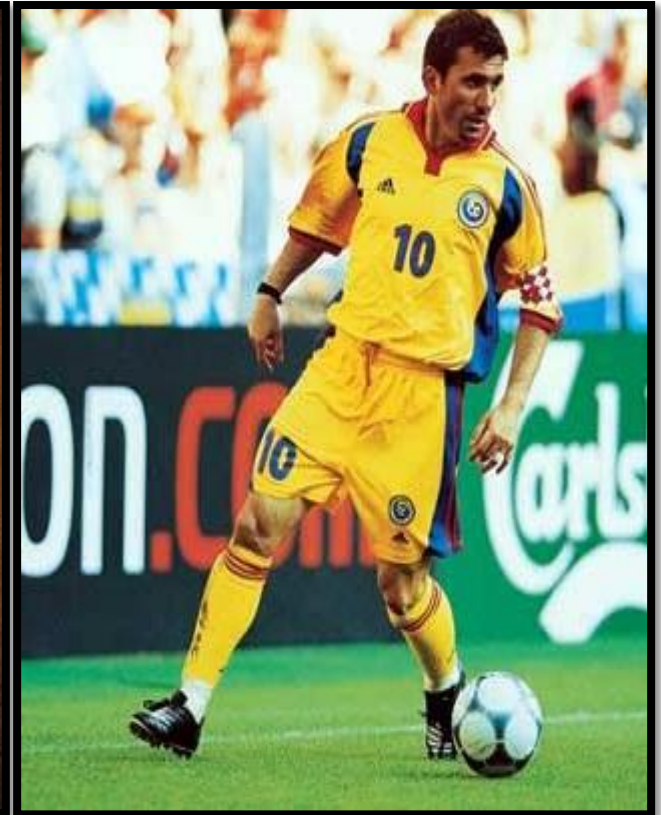
NADIA COMĂNECI

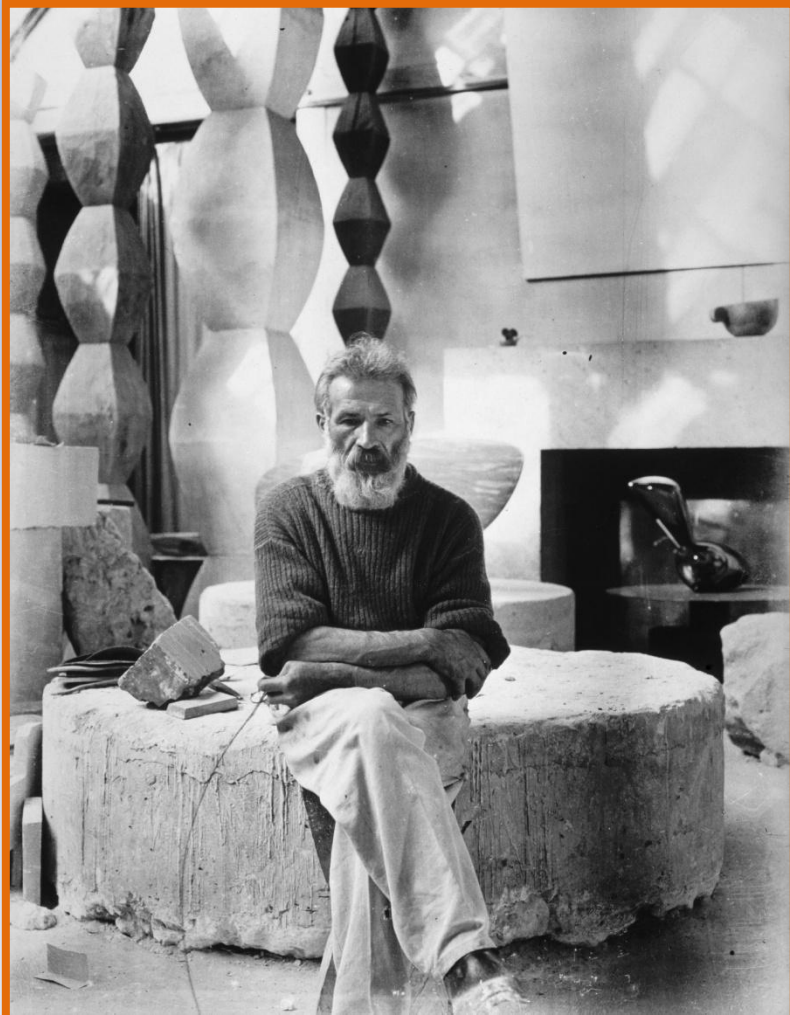
GHEORGHE HAGI

is the Romanian most famous sculpture. He is considered to be the pioneer of modernism and he is called the patriarch of modern sculpture.



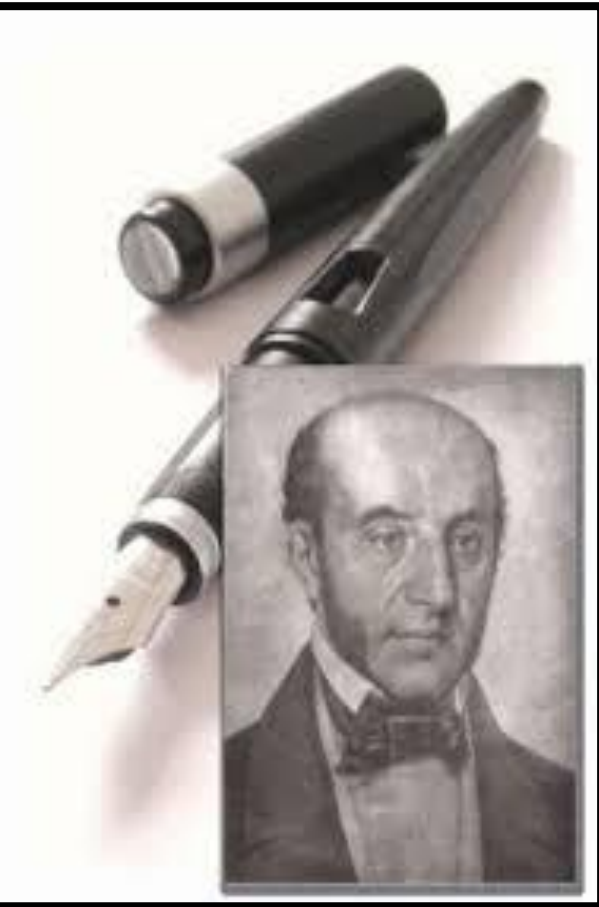
GEORGE ENESCU

was a Romanian composer, violinist, pianist, conductor and teacher, preeminent musician of the 20th century, one of the greatest performers of his time.



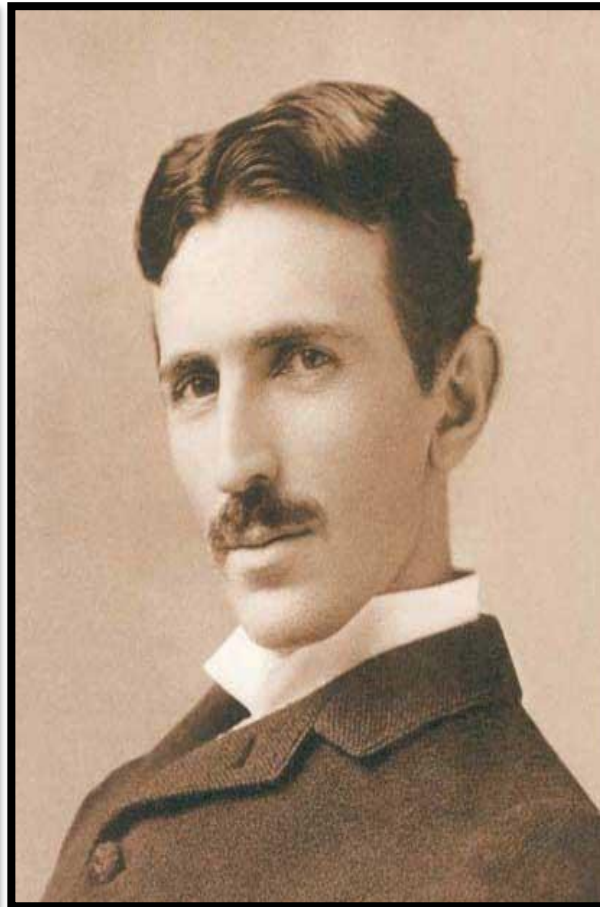

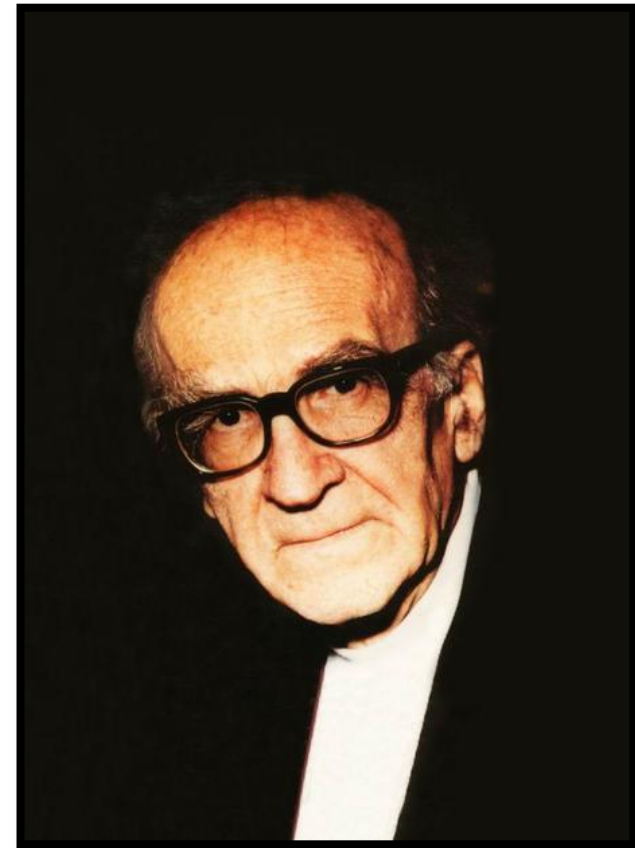
